Lois Marilynn Roberts was born to William and Violet Green in Sunnyside Washington on March 19, 1948. She was the youngest of seven children: Kenny, Howard, Gary, Virginia, Norma, and Vern. Lois is survived by her husband Norm and two sons; Eric and his wife Melenie, Guy and his wife Amanda, and three grandchildren; William, Audrey, and Jace. Also, her sister-in-law Kay Green, along with many cousins, nieces, and nephews all of whom she loved dearly.

She grew up on a farm helping tend to the animals. She and her Brother Vern even raised a pet pig together. Living on a farm was a simple life and although she grew up without much, she always felt well provided for by her parents. Her mother passed when she was 12. She moved out on her own when she was 16 and applied herself to her studies, obtaining a business degree and her teaching credentials.

She lived in Washington, Oregon, New Jersey, Mississippi and eventually settled in California. While living in San Jose, she went out with a friend to a local dance hall where she met her future husband Norm. He was out with a buddy and they noticed some modestly dressed ladies. They flipped a coin to see who would talk to the blonde. Norm says he won the coin toss, Lois joked that she lost the coin toss...

After a brief courtship, Norm and Lois were married in Belmar, New Jersey by the local mayor on October 2, 1970. After Norm finished out his service in the Air force, they settled in San Jose and started their family. They welcomed Eric in 1978 and Guy in 1980. Norm and Lois' marriage lasted over 55 years, something they were both very proud of.

Lois had many jobs over the years working for PacBell, as a teacher, bookkeeper, travel agent and ran a daycare for nearly 30 years. She was also involved in research for those with spinal cord injuries. She enjoyed reading, learning, and playing cards. She found great joy in her personal study of the Bible. She also enjoyed shopping and thrifting, always looking for a deal. She loved to travel. Locally the family enjoyed drives to the coast, going up to the snow or to the beach. Norm and Lois also enjoyed cruising together with family and friends and got to see many countries around the world. There were many trips to Hawaii, a favorite destination. Lois had a favorite camping spot in Lake Almanor where boating, games, music, good food, and pinochle were shared with many of her friends.

Despite developing diabetes as a young girl, she never let that stop her. She said she got her determination and drive from her mom, and a hard working spirit and a love for her family from her Dad. Another thing she acquired from her parents was a love for God. She was baptized in a horse trough in 1957 along with her parents.

Before she married, she spent time pioneering with friends in Mississippi and with her older brother Gary and sister-in-law Flavia. She was active in her congregation, pioneering over the years, regularly attending the meetings and still active in the ministry despite her later health struggles. In her ministry over the years she was able to have a part in helping many learn about Jehovah and would look for, reach out to, and try to help those who were going through difficult times. Lois felt drawn to people and they could feel her genuine interest in them. She also was a great support for her family, being an example in remaining faithful to Jehovah God despite challenges.

She looked forward to the Bible's promises found in Revelation 21:3,4 when sickness and death will be no more. She also showed a strong faith in the promised resurrection found at John 5:28,29 as she told her family before she passed that we didn't need to be sad and we'll be looking for each other when she is resurrected. We all look forward to that time when we welcome back our loved ones.
